

CAT MASK



Cat Mask for kids

One size

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SUPPLIES

Fabric scraps are enough for these masks. For one mask, you will need 3 different fabrics: one for the top part of the mask (Fabric 1), one for the bottom part (Fabric 2) and one for lining the mask (Fabric 3). Ears and nose are made out of felt.

Suggested Fabrics:

Fabrics 1 & 2: scraps of cotton, batiste, poplin...

Fabric 3: scrap of heavy-weight cotton, linen, gabardine, denim (if Fabric 3 is too lightweight, you can interface it if necessary).

Notions:

- Matching threads,

- 2 x 40 cm of 1cm-ribbon (for each of my versions, I used velvet ribbon instead of satin ribbon. Once tied, velvet holds better),

- Scrap of felt

PATTERN

Cf Annexes 1 & 2 - Print these pages at 100% or check "actual scale" in the Print dialog box. Check that the scale of the 5cm-test square is correct.

Pattern Pieces:

- Cut Piece 1 once in Fabric 1,
- Cut Piece 2 once in Fabric 2,
- Cut Piece 3 once in Fabric 3,
- Cut the nose once in felt,
- Cut ears twice in felt.



SEAM ALLOWANCES

Seam allowances are included. **Warning**: seam allowance around pieces 1,2, and 3 is <u>0,5 cm</u>.



ASSEMBLY STEP 1

• With right sides together, pin the bottom of Piece 1 to the top of Piece 2.



• Stitch at 0,5cm from the edge,



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• Clip the curve and press the seam open.



STEP 2


• With right sides together, place each end of the ribbon at their respective marking on the mask. The ends of the ribbon are against the seamline.

• Baste or pin in place.





• With right sides together, place the lining (Fabric 3) on the pieces sewn previously. (the ribbon is sandwiched between the two parts of the mask)



• Stitch around the mask at 0,5cm, leaving a 2-3cm-opening at the top of the mask (between the ears). **Warning**: Ribbons must stay away from the seamline. They might go out of the opening.



• Clip the seam allowances and the corners around the mask.





• Turn the mask on the right side with the help of the ribbons,



• Use a stick to push the angles from the inside (don't use a sharp stick to avoid ripping the fabric).



• Press the seams well to help shaping the mask.




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• Using the overview given on page 1, draw a template in cardboard and hollow the parts corresponding to the eyes.

• Then place the template on the right side of the mask and draw the eyes directly on it, with an erasable pen.











• Hollow each eye on the mask by cutting fabric close to the satin stitch. Do not cut into the seam.



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• Using the same template on page 1, place the felt ears and nose on the fabric mask.



• Stitch them all around with a straight stitch, at 1mm from the edge.






• Slipstitch the opening closed at the top of the mask (If necessary, you can check the Technical Guide>Technical Tutorials>The Basics-Slip Stitch : <u>https://pm-patterns.com/en/content/28-technique-de-base</u>).
